




Communication, & Language

Maths



- To compare amounts using lots, more, less
- To compare sizes using bigger, smaller

How to help at home

- Talk about the sound of the week (shared weekly on Tapestry) and encourage children to notice it in words
- Practise the rhyme of the week (shared weekly on Tapestry) and/or sing other rhymes and songs at home
- Talk to your child about their feelings, support them to name their feelings e.g. happy, sad, scared and support them to give a reason for the feeling e.g. losing a toy
