Tappytoon -

The recommended minimum age for this app is 17. However, we can already report that it will expose your child to a little cartoon violence, horror and fear themes, alcohol, tobacco or drugs use or references, sexual and nudity themes, mature or suggestive themes, and profanity or crude humour.

Crunchyroll –

The recommended minimum age for this app is 16.

Age-inappropriate content. Crunchyroll hosts a wide array of anime, ranging from family-friendly shows to those with more mature themes like violence, sexual content, and strong language. Most titles on the site are suitable for teens, but younger children can still easily come across shows that aren't appropriate for their age group. This is because only 18+ content can be filtered out by Crunchyroll's built-in parental controls, and there is no age verification system in place on the site.

Safetydetectives.com

The above sites were logins attempted in school by pupils this half term. Our filtering and monitoring systems disabled children's access these sites and alerted us that it was attempted. In school we are then able to speak to children about staying safe online and why these sites may not be suitable. During these discussions it was clear that some children are aware of parental controls and restrictions. However, some were not able to discuss this.
